Synodality and Mission

Papal, Austen Ivereigh, defines synodality as "a method and process of discussion and participation in which the whole people of God can listen to the Holy Spirit and take part in the life and mission of the Church."

Synod comes from the Greek syn and odos (meaning "with" and "path") and refers to a way of living or working together. A biblical passage for synodality that Pope Francis gives is that of the disciples on the road to Emmaus, where Cleopas and his companion are joined by the resurrected Jesus, who walks with them and explains the scriptures to them. The biblical passage ends with a meal in which they finally recognize him in the breaking of the bread. Synodality is about walking together in a shared search for Christ in scripture, prayer, and common life.

Pope Francis has initiated a consultation process throughout the Church, first in parishes and dioceses and then in national and regional bodies, culminating in the Synod of Bishops gathering in October 2023.

During the diocesan phase, groups throughout the local church parishes, deaneries, religious orders, schools, youth groups, seniors' homes, mission teams, etc. will reflect on a "fundamental question" about journeying together as a synodal church: "How is this 'journeying together' happening today in your local Church, your community, your mission apostolate? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our 'journeying together'?"

October was the mission month. We were invited again to reflect upon the Church and its mission. To do this reflection adequately, we need to rethink how we understand the word 'mission'. We are accustomed to identifying the mission of an organisation with nice words on a wall or a vision statement for a particular Congregation which puts it up for all to see and then forgotten. For the Church, mission is different. Pope John Paul II said in Redemptor is Missio:

"The Church is missionary by her very nature, for Christ's mandate is not something external, but reaches the very heart of the Church"

In this sense, the Church does not have a mission the Church is a mission, her very nature is missionary. She exists to be mission in the world in

all languages, cultures, and places, to proclaim the love of God to all people.

Advent is a springtime for spiritual renewal. The experience of the Synodal process should bring about a new spring time for listening, discernment, dialogue, and decision - making so that the whole people of God can be then journeying together with one another and the entire human family under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Synod is a call to Personal Conversion and Social Transformation. We need to repent both as individuals and as the Church as people of God or disciples of Christ. There is much that needs to be put in order in our homes, parishes, communities, dioceses, congregations as well as in our own personal lives. The paths have to be made straight and wicked and sinful ways need to be given up. Valleys of selfishness need to be filled with love and compassion for the poor. Mountains and hills of pride and arrogance need to be made low with humility and meekness. Rough and tough attitudes and behaviours need to be replaced with gentleness and patience. Without such personal and social transformation, we will not have much success and desired results from the Synodal Process.

A clarion call to begin the Synodal Process in our Communities:

Sr. Marina has beautifully chalked out a programme for our monthly recollections to help us prepare ourselves by a spiritual renewal journeying together asa Congregation. In her letter to the Province dt. 16/11/2021 she said, "We need to think, talk and act in the 'Synodal Way'- Journeying together, listening to the Spirit and to one another"

So dear sisters let us with enthusiasm and zeal prepare the recollection talks and inspire one another to go the Synodal Way.

Advent - Waiting in Hope

The word "ADVENT" is derived from the Latin word, 'Adventus' which translates to "coming". Down the centuries, the season of Advent is known as a season of spiritual preparation for the coming of our Lord; God becoming human through his Son Jesus Christ. It is a time to meditate with eyes wide open and to ponder in our hearts, 'Mary's 'yes', Joseph's dreams. John the Baptist's cries in the



wilderness. It's a time to purify ourselves for his arrival.

Its a season of HOPE. The people of ancient Israel, longed for the coming of the Saviour who would bring them New Hope, Justice, Peace and Dignity. The Liturgy of the season reminds us that we are a people called to live by God's promises. Prophet Jeremiah tells us, "The days are coming when I am going to fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah".

Luke 21: 25-36 is exhorting us to be alert to face the Son of God for when He comes, He will lead us to a better tomorrow. This is the blessing of the incarnation of Christ.

Advent is a GIFT. A time to behold the wonders that God is working for us through his Son Jesus Christ. We can hear God clearer in His message of love and salvation in the birth of his Son when we embrace hope, joy and preparation. This season therefore calls us to focus on, "Prepare the way for the Lord." In Mt.3:1-12; Mk.1:1-8 & Lk.3:1-6 John the Baptist & the Prophet Isaiah give the account of the coming of Jesus as an obscure child who will return to judge all things.

The coming of the Lord is for his action in the individuals and the community. He invites us to slow down and enjoy the hope and miracle that each day of life brings us and fill our deepest emptiness with God. This preparation teaches us the lessons in waiting, the joy in anticipation, the pricelessness of hope. This pause leads us to recapture those simple moments, - a smile, the twinkling of the candle, the laughter of children, the soothing melodies of the music we hear once a year. All these deepen our experience of Christmas. We do this both through our prayer and service. If we are attentive during this time of anticipation and waiting for Jesus,

God will surprise us with His presence. We will find Him in unexpected places. Honoring this time by good works prepares our hearts to recapture what we are seeking - *Emmanuel - 'God with us'*.

The wreath holds four a d v e n t c a n d l e s representing Jesus' coming as the light in the darkness. One candle is lit each Sunday of Advent until all four candles are lit each symbolizing an

aspect of preparation. The first purple candle stands for Hope. The purple Color within the Catholic church symbolizing penance, preparation and sacrifice. The second purple candle is for Peace, everyone reflects on their lives and works to become better for Jesus' coming. The third candle in Pink is the candle of Joy, representing anticipation and rejoicing for the near arrival of Jesus. The fourth candle is called the candle of Love bringing the message of endless, visible and tangible love that God has for everyone in the birth of God's own Son, Jesus Christ.

The Advent season which we always cherish, holds even greater meaning during the pandemic times. It has brought nations together in their search for a remedy for the COVID 19 health issues. Millions of people across the globe, the affluent, the poor, the young, the old, those in the west, those in the east, those of the first world, those of the third world, all in their struggle, helplessness, pain and suffering have waited in hope for helping hands to reach them to a hospital, find a bed with oxygen supply, to get some food, care, some even to reach them to a cemetery/crematorium and some lucky ones to get back home and start life all over again.

Let those suffering, lonely, mourning, those who lost job and those who are spared from COVID -19 together honour this coming season of Advent as gracefilled and fulfilled days. Even in the midst of our busy schedule, allow Christ to be reborn in the Bethlehems of our hearts, homes and communities. It is for me to be awake, to the Divine Mystery that unfolds in the hearts of each one of us, specially, during this coming Advent Season. --- Come Lord Jesus Come.

Experiences of Courses

Renewal Programme for Jubilarians

It was a unique experience for us 6 golden jubilarians to attend a renewal programme at 'Prerana' in Bangalore from 11th - 30th October 2021 including an Intensive Journal Retreat. Since all six of us from the time of our novitiate till this day could attend the course, it was a wonderful experience being together and sharing all the joyful and painful experiences we have gone through down the years wherever we have been and whatever apostolate we have done. We are ever grateful to Sr. Marina for this God-gift opportunity to attend the course which was well organised with appropriate topics pertaining to our age by Fr. Prashant D'Souza and his team. Fr Jossie D'Mello was the opening batsman who spoke to us on 'Spirituality - a Faith Journey'. The highlights of the talks:

- i) Our life is a pilgrimage so we ask ourselves: Where do I come from, where am I going and who is God for me.? These were soul-searching questions which when we honestly answered to ourselves helped us in our inward journey.
- ii) Faith is a journey not a destination. This realization helped us to continue our inward journey, by keeping abreast with the times, reading, reflecting, learning new skills, meeting and learning from people etc. a journey of relationship with God, self, others, and the cosmos.
- "An Unexamined life is not worth living" said Socrates.

The next speaker was Fr. Kulandai Raj who gave us a course on 'Midlife Transition' Aging gracefully means accepting myself as I am.

Issues that affect us in Mid-life are:

1. Health: Body was strong, now not much strength left, movements slow.

- **2.Life becomes mechanical:** Every day is same work, ministry etc. Mass becomes mechanical, no zest. Depression setting in.
- **3. loneliness:**-Loneliness is felt by everyone. The heart is restless until it rests in God.
- **4.My relationships:** Earlier had many friends, now not so sure. Relationships diminish, fall like dry leaves.
- **5. Questions of Mortality:** Death awareness- death thoughts come bombarding, death news can be terrorising. What will happen after death. No more sure of heaven or hell.
- **6. My Contribution**: What have I given to life? 'My contribution to the Congregation, country my own creation?
- 7. Have I met my Dreams? Before joining I had many dreams. Do I have regrets for missed opportunities?
- **8. Unfinished Business:** Hidden resentment, unhealed wounds. Repressed and suppressed materials come up at this age.
- **9. Time of Unpredictabilty:** I don't know what will happen to me, family etc... therefore feelings of anxiety, insecurity creep in.
- **10. Time of New Beginning:** New start..... unless you are born again with water and the spirit... deepen your spiritual roots and foundation.

These sessions were an eye-opener to us making us realize very deeply that we are at the sunset of our lives. Being grateful for the many years God has given us and wanting to make the best use of the time left.

Regularly through self-awareness, we were asked to reflect on our purpose of coming and to see if we are able to connect all that is been done during the sessions by writing a short summary of each class.

Now having learnt about process spirituality, I do find meaning in my psycho-spiritual journey. Initially it was



difficult to sit quietly in one place, but when I began with centering prayer, it helped me to go deeper into silence and try to discern what God must be telling me through all that is happening in my life.

For me the invitation was to go down into the well of my being, the deep places of my psyche and soul- through introspection, reading, writing and drawing, my sharing in small and big groups. The inputs of different modules and the movies, my companionship, my prayer and meditation on the Word of God and Nature, in the existential realities of my everyday life, in sacred Scripture, my exploration in group therapy and retreat, have helped me to know myself better.

I have been able to discover through these processes the dynamics operating in my life, my dysfunctional life pattern, my identity, my shadows, my realized and unrealized dreams and ways, I have been and wanting to be generative. 

Recipes

- **1. Oatmeal cookies Ingredients:** 280 grams oats, 800 gms groundnuts, 400 grams powdered sugar, 120 grams butter, 4 eggs, juice of 2 lemons. Method:
- 1. Mix the butter, sugar, and eggs.
- 2. Slowly mix the powdered groundnuts (roasted)
- 3. Mix the oats in the batter
- 4. Place spoonful of the batter on the greased baking tray.
- 5. Bake oat biscuits in a preheated oven at 120 degrees celsius for 30 minutes.
- 2. Date rolls: Ingredients: 200 grams maida, one egg, 60 g powdered sugar, 100 grams butter, 100 grams walnuts, 200 grams seedless dates. Method: 1. Cream butter and sugar using an electric beater. 2. Add beaten egg and add this mixture to the maida and knead into a soft dough. 3. Put a piece of walnut in the centre of the date. 4. Roll the dough quarter inch thick, cut into strips and further cut the strips into three or four inches, and roll a date in each. Apply water to seal the date. the edges. 5. Place the rolls in a baking tray, brush the top of the roll with egg yolk and bake in a preheated oven for 10 to 15 minutes at 160 degrees celsius.

Activities at Maria Sadan---- Jharsuguda

As we journey each day ,we come to know the will of God and He gives the opportunities to see situations and act accordingly for the glory of him by serving his people. The girls' hostel has been closed due to lock

We have started tailoring classes for women and girls, support classes and extra curricular activities like dance, drawing, motivation classes, Computer etc.

Different activities are done with women to improver their economical conditions.

- Two widows are provided with sewing machines.
- Flour mill [masalaetc]
- Rice husk removal machine.
- Women's SHG has taken up mushroom cultivation project as an income generating activity.
- Three women started goat- rearing.



- Seven lepers sick and old are provided with food .

For the youth

- Education and training program as well as finding jobs for them.
- Two girls are doing nurses' training.
- One girl is doing B-ed.



- Six girls and three boys are sent to Bhubaneswar for a business management course.
- Eight boys are sent to Gujarat for work in a rubber factory.

Housing - Three houses are built for the poor Tribals. One house for a leper, and four houses were repaired.

Prison ministry.

We have started net working with three prisons. According to Covid19 restriction, we visit from time to time and see how we can support them.

Celebration of Prison Formation Day and Human Rights Day at Sambalpur, Nari Bandan Niketan prison was celebrated.



We now plan to start income generating activities like detergent, soaps, LED bulb, etc. We also give counseling and motivation talks to those in need.

We are asking people to stop making rice beer and liquor and start some small income generating activities so that they will make a difference in their families, in the village, and in the society.
